
Institutional Partnership Project 2022 Annual Report by MHPK



During 2022 Muslim Hands Pakistan has successfully secured PKR 587 million Approx. and USD 3 million and executed different projects under multi sectors during humanitarian and development phases.

Public Private Partnerships

Schools with Punjab education Foundation

Education with special focus on girls'

In Punjab

In partnership with PIEMA & Punjab Education Foundation Muslim Hands has been managing 152 public sector primary level schools under 02 initiatives of government of Punjab

Annual Subsidy/budget for the year 2022 is PKR 76,000,000 & USD 380,000

1-Public School Support Programme-PSSP

Project Back Ground:

Muslim Hands Organization is determined to bring the social change through education in all over the country with ambit of Government of Pakistan. Muslim Hands believes that Public-Private Partnership (PPP) is one of the most effective instrument to enhance private sector participation in public services delivery, especially in education sector. For this purpose under PSSP -1-2,3 and 4 Muslim Hands signed an agreement with Punjab Education Foundation under "Public School Support Program- PSSP" projects on March 7th, 2016, July 01,2016, March 2017 and November 2022 respectively, for making



functional and providing quality education in 145 low performing Government schools of four districts including Lahore, Gujranwala, Jhelum, Rawalpindi and Sheikhupura. These schools are mostly in slums or far-flung areas and there were issues like shortage or dangerous schools buildings, shortage of water and toilets, non-availability of teachers, poor PEC result and lack of interaction with Community.

Major Achievements during 2022:

- 1. 19135 students retained and enrolled during the year 2022 with a ratio of 50% girls and inclusion of 27 disabled children
- 2. Increase in enrollment up to 90 % and retained from the last year.
- 3. Conducted 3343 Monitoring/ support visits to the project Schools.
- 4. QAT passing score remained 88% for the year 2022-23

Schools with Punjab Education Foundation

- 5. Out of 101 Schools 24 verified as 100% while 73 remained above 80% at the time of verification by the Govt Official. Only 4 were below 80%.
- 6. Average MEA attendance for these schools remained 84 % during surprise visit of MEA.
- 7. In the capacity building exercise 487 teachers were trained under different teachers Training Programs
- 8. Survey of 98 villages was held to collect the data of OOSC in these target villages.
- 9. Books Distribution to all enrolled children were distributed in the PSSP schools.
- 10. 13 New Rooms were constructed in the existing PSSP schools through MH core funding and local fund raising

2- New Schools Program-NSP

Project Back Ground:

New School Program was launched to engage private sector entrepreneurs in order to set up new schools in remote, distant and under-served areas of the province. NSP targets to establish schools in areas where there is access gap as government or private schools are unavailable or very few in number. In NSP, new schools are opened at sites where no formal government or PEF school exists within 1km radius of the site and there is population of approximately 350 people. In addition to opening of new schools, already functional schools in eligible areas are also invited to get affiliated with PEF-NSP. Moreover, schools are encouraged for up-gradation in order to improve transition from one level to another. Muslim Hands has been managing 07 low profile public sector schools in district Okara and Gujranwala (Wazirabad)

Major Achievements during 2022:

- 1- 469 students were retained with ratio of 50% girls during year 2022
- 2- 04 schools were passed in QAT Exam,
- 3- More than one hundred new admissions were made during the year
- 4- 247 monitoring/ Support visits were conducted during the year.
- 5- 16 visits were conducted by PEF Monitor in which attendance remained above 90% as an average in these schools.
- 6- SIS Verification remained 80 % or above in all these schools.



In Sindh

Schools with Sindh Education Foundation

In partnership with Sindh Education Foundation Muslim Hands has been managing 12 public sector schools up to higher secondary level in district Badin & Tando Muhammad Khan.

<u>Project Back Ground:</u> The project was initiated in 2017 in partnership with Sindh Education Foundation, Government of Sindh. Under this partnership MH has been managing 12 schools including primary, elementary and secondary levels. These schools were low performing with very less enrollment. After taking over these schools MH has increased its enrollment and retained the students with more than 90%. Additionally MH has rehabilitated the infrastructure of these school buildings and provided with other school facilities including furniture, toilets, clean drinking water and solar systems etc.

- 1- 2584 children receiving a Muslim Hands supported education
- 2- Provide free books.
- 3- Enrollment campaigns were conducted and out-of-school children were enrolled
- 4- Renovation of school and construction of new classrooms after monsoon floods completed and 13 new classrooms were also constructed from Muslim Hands core funding





Scottish Scholarship Schemes in Swat-KP & Islamabad

In Partnership with British Council

It is another initiative of Muslim Hands in partnership with British Council which is continued since 2015 with an objective to enroll and retain girl's students and to encourage parents and communities for the education of their daughters through in kind financial support. Under this intervention we are providing scholarships for disadvantaged, poor and needy girl students from grade 8th and above (13 to 16 years). Till date we have facilitated more than 3000 female/girl students in different public sector and low profile private schools in district Swat and Peshawar (KP). During 2022 we have singed another agreement with British Council for next three years in which we will provide scholarships to female/girls students who are from underprivileged, disabled and minority groups in ICT and KP through in kind support including uniform, shoes, notebooks, school bags/stationary and MHM/H&H kits. Total financial contributions of this project during 2022 PKR 5,400,000.

- 1- 300 girls studying at elementary to higher secondary levels were benefitted through scholarships during 2022
- 2- Through in kind support school kit designed for each beneficiary girl student including uniform, stationary, scientific calculator, shoes, bag and MHM kit.
- 3- Additionally awareness sessions on H&H/MHM were also delivered in the selected schools







EDGE: English & Digital Education for Girls in Punjab & KP

In Partnership with British Council

The purpose of this programme is to improve the life prospects of adolescent girls in socio-economically marginalized communities. It focuses on enhancing participants' English proficiency, digital skills and awareness of social issues.

Major Achievements:

- 1- 47 clubs have been formed targeting capacity building of more than 500 girls under the project.2-
- 2- Total 95 Venue coordinators have been trained in Islamabad, Peshawar, Wazirabad, Bhera, Lahore and GK region who will assist PGLs in conducting their weekly meeting on English, Digital & social skills.
- 3- 95 PGLs who have been thoroughly trained on their roles & responsibilities have initiated weekly club meeting benefitting more than 500 girls in their respective region.



Establishment of Science Lab/School Paly Ground Refurbishment:

With the contributions of TIKA, Science Lab of MH Islamabad School of Excellence have been established and equipped with all essential facilities. More than 600 students will be benefitted through this lab.

Additionally school playground was also revamped with new grass and boundary wall of school painted by the volunteers of TIKA.

Livelihoods-bringing change through resilience and building capacities Access to Energy in Sindh & Balochistan


Access to Energy in Partnership with Schneider Foundation France

<u>Back Ground of the Project:</u> Phase II: Access to Energy in partnership with Schneider Electric France: A contract has been signed with TEVTA Sindh & Baluchistan, in total 40 labs have been identified (25 Sindh, 15 Baluchistan).

Achievements during 2022:

Under this project following major activities conducted during 2022

- 1. Agreement has been signed with Schneider Electric France for 03 years
- 2. TEVTA Balochistan & Sindh contacted and agreements have been signed for labs up gradation
- 3. 03 labs upgraded as per standards of TEVTA
- 4. 26 Labs have received maintenance and rebranding facilities completed under phase-I

Relief Assistance for Flood Affected Families in Sohbatpur District – Balochistan

Project Summary: The project has been signed in October 2022 with Concern Rapid Fund (USAID-BHA) for emergency relief assistance of flood affected district Sohbatpur Balochistan. Major interventions of this project include provision of emergency tool kits, bedding kits and H&H/dignity kits. Initially the project was designed to cater 1700

families but keeping in view the need of target communities it was extended further and will facilitate in total 3460 families with same package. The time frame project also extended till 25th March 2023. Total funding of this project is PKR 105,907,472.

- 1. 2990 flood affected families provided with emergency shelter kits
- 2. 2990 flood affected families provided with bedding kits
- 3. 2990 flood affected families H&H/Dignity kits along with awareness sessions
- 4. 650 families will be identified further and provided with same package in extended period of the project till 25th March 2023
- 5. 5000 people were outreached with awareness session on H&H and nutrition





Flood Emergency Response in flood affected areas of Sindh

In partnership with CESVI and financial funding of USAID. It was in kind support of PKR 158,000,000 and USD 790,000. 03flood affected districts in Sindh were selected for this intervention.

- 1. 3000 affected families were provided with emergency shelter kits and essential household items
- 2. 03 districts were outreached through this activity
- 3. Under integrated approach mobile medical camps were also organized in same target areas.









Health & Nutrition

Strengthening primary healthcare services by integrating health nutrition & WASH

In flood affected district Jhal Magsi Balochistan.

<u>Project Back Ground:</u> In partnership with UNICEF with funding of PKR 26,000,000. The project was initiated for flood affected communities in district Jhal Magsi-Balochistan. It has been completed by 30th January 2023. Major interventions included strengthening of 12 EPI centers through provision of furniture , medical equipment's and infrastructure rehabilitation, provision of 03 months medicines to 10 BHUs, Mobile health camps, IYCF sessions for PLWs and children and awareness raising sessions on H&H and nutrition.

Major Achievements of 2022:

- 1. 8025 community members male, female, children's were trained through Capacity Building and awareness programs concerning to basic health in which Health and Hygiene, Immunization, anemia, IYCF, Dietary Diversity included.
- 2. MH Arranged free 50 Medical Camps with equipped mobile ambulance service in which MH medical team treated 9198 patents whereas 613 children identify and refer to nearest EPI centers.
- 3. Provision of Minor Facilitations to basic primary units;
- 4. Enhanced Networking & Coordination.
- 10 BHU received additional Medicine support for their regular OPD during emergency for three
 months in which 17356 OPD for the month of Nov and Dec 2022 whereas 111 live birth, First
 antenatal care visits 921, antenatal care visit 170, pregnant women 390 TT care reported during
 project period
- 6. 12 EPI center equipped with Furniture's and minor repair with White wash
- IEC material distributed and covers Health and Hygiene, Immunization, anemia, IYCF, Dietary Diversity.



Mobile Health Unit



Mobile Health Unit

In Partnership with TIKA, Muslim Hands initiated this project in which a refurbished unit donated by TIKA along with one month medicines. Its operation and maintenance has been managed with integration of MH core program of health. Total worth of this units is PKR 30,000,000 and in USD 150,000. It was handed over to MH in the month December 2022.

- 1. In continuation and to operationalize the unit MH organized 02 day medical camp in flood affected district Charsadda –KP
- 2. Around 500 patients were catered during camp including more than 50% pregnant and lactating mothers and children
- 3. General checkups were conducted and free lifesaving medicines were also distributed



Food Security

In Collaboration with Qarshi Foundation

Food Security/Emergency Response in South Punjab

Back Ground: In partnership with Qarshi Foundation Muslim Hands has executed 02 projects with in kind support during Ramadan and emergency response of floods 2022 Total worth of in kind support was PKR 9,600,000 and USD 48,000

1-Ramadan Project: 3600 Qarshi Jame Shirin bottles were distributed during the month of Ramadan among 1700 families.

2-Floods 2022 Emergency Response: Herbal medicines were distributed among 2500 flood affected families in district Rajanpur and DG Khan (South Punjab). Along with this a doctor arranged by Qarshi Foundation had delivered demonstration over the use of these herbal medicines.







Climate Change & Youth Engagement

Climate Led Youth Actions in Partnership with British Council

MH has secured 02 projects on youth and climate change from British Council during 2022. Total worth of these projects are PKR 11,520,000 and USD 57,600.

<u>1-Challenge Fund 2022:</u> 11 projects were identified and selected by British Council on the issue of climate change and girls education across Pakistan. These projects were called by active citizens of British Council. Muslim Hands being strategic partner has been managing their grants financially and technically.

2-Youth Led Climate Action: It is small grant which has been granted to Muslim Hands for youth led climate action. The project will mainly focus on climate resilient actions among those communities who are multi disaster affected. The execution will be through youth leaders who will further train small farmers on Good Agriculture Practices and Kitchen Gardening. Additionally they will be given agriculture tool kits and essential seasonal seeds to preserve their livelihoods during future disasters.
